


Whereas there was formerly laid out to John Moor Sabian Cole and Company a tract of land in the County of Chester for two thousand acres the right whereof is now vested in Reece Thomas and Anthony Morris, Junr. This may certifie that pursuant to a warrant dated the 30th day of the 3^d Month 1718. The said tract was resurvey'd on the 8th day of the eighth month in the same year and found to contain one thousand seven hundred and six three acres. Beginning at a post at a corner of the land of James Gibbons and Thomas Mercer thence extending North 24 degrees Westerly ^{seventy} by the land of the said James Gibbons four hundred three ^A perches to a white oak thence South sixty six degrees Westerly by the land late of Thomas Lloyd deceased and the land of John Millison three hundred thirty and three perches to a black oak thence South South East by the land late of the said Thomas Lloyd one hundred and eighteen perches to a Chestnut tree thence South ^{land} seventy six degrees West by the last mentioned three hundred twenty seven perches to a white oak thence south twenty four degrees easterly by the land of Richard Collet four hundred and eleven perches to a post thence north sixty six degrees easterly by the lands of John Yearsly Richard Evinson and the said Thomas Mercer six hundred red fifty eight perches to the place of beginning containing one thousand seven hundred & sixty three acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this sixth day of April 1909
