


Pensilvania }

At the request of Owen Thomas Attorney for Henry Saunders  
that we would grant him to take up a survey on two hundred  
and fifty acres of land within the bounds of the Welch tract  
purchased by the said Henry or Sn<sup>o</sup> Poyer purchaser of seven  
hundred and fifty acres. These are to require thenceforth  
to survey and lay out to the said Henry Saunders the said  
quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land within the  
bounds of the said Welch tract where not already taken up  
or seated and make returns thereof into the General Survey-  
ors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain  
and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the  
Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of thy return  
into his office. Given under our hands and the seal of the  
Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
