


Pennsylvania 5s



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Griffith Thomas of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up a certain parcell of vacant land of about one hundred acres lying between the land late Richard Thomas's and the Barrens in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>ts</sup> use fifteen pounds money of this Province and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for the same. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Griffith Thomas in the place aforesaid the said quantity of one hundred acres of land contiguous to the surveys already made and according to the method of townships and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Griffith —— fulfill the above agreement within one month after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
