Whereas Richard Thomas Son and heir of Richard ap Thomas deceased purchaser ~~of~~ of five thousand acres of land in this Province having had the full quantity of acres of the said purchase already laid out to him amongst which there was six hundred acres in Newtown in the County of Chester claimed by other persons by means whereof the said Richard _____ could not peaceably hold the same whereupon he hath released to the Proprietors all his rights title and claim ~~to~~ thereunto and in lieu thereof hath already had confirmed to him two hundred forty three acres and the remaining three hundred fifty seven acres he now requests may be laid out to him which compleats the whole purchase. These therefore are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Richard Thomas in the said County of Chester the said quantity of three hundred fifty seven acres of land according to the method of townships appointed and that hath not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation.
