



By vertue of a warant from the proprietor and Goverour bearing date the 13 day of ye first month 1684 for the surveying of about 4000 acres of land in this province for the purchasers in North and South Wales &c. Ther was surveyed unto Richard Thomas son ad heire to Richard ap Thomas purchaser of 5000 acres in the said compainy, 200 acres part of the said 5000 acres situate in the Great Valey in the Count of Chester. Beginning at a stake set in the ground being the corner post of David Jones's land, thence by a line of marked trees N. N. W. 394 perches to another stake set in the ground, thence W. S. W. by a line of marked trees 81 perches to another stake, thence S. S. E. 394 perches to another corner post in the said David Jones's line, thence E. N. E. by the said David Jones land 81 perches to the place of begining laid out for 200 acres according to the bounds above described or about the 20<sup>th</sup> of I<sup>m</sup> 1701.
