


Pensilvania }



By the Commissioners of Property.

In pursuance of an agreemt made between us and Abiah Taylor upon his request to take up ye remainder of John Tovey's original purchase being four hundred and seventy five acres (the liberty land being first deducted) and for his better accommodation & settlemt in this Province. These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the sd Abiah Taylor the sd quantity or so much as shall be found thereof in that vacancy remaining after Thomas Buffington's survey in ye forks of Brandywine taking ye same even as it runs without colling or choosing, and make return into the General Surveyor's office at Philad'lia where this warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
