

At the request of Ab*ie*iah Taylor that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in this Province in right and as part of twelve hundred and fifty acres the original purchase of John Tovey. These are to authorize and require thee to survey & lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> Ab*ie*iah <sup>Taylor</sup> Walker according to the method of townships appointed the s<sup>d</sup> number of five hundred acres of land in the County of Chester where not already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philad*ia* where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
