

By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas the Proprietary by his warrant under his hand and seal bearing date the 2^d of the 7th month in the year 1700 granted to James Thomas to take up three hundred acres of land in right of William Jenkins old purchaser of a thousand acres which thousand being one of the Welch purchases ought to have been laid in the Welch tract and the said James accordingly requesting us by renewing the sd warr^t to order the location thereof as aforesd. These are to require thee forthwth to survey and lay out in the Welch tract the sd three hundred acres of land where not already survey'd nor taken up and make returns thereof into the Genl Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warr^t is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee attested by the Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of thy return into his office. Given under our hands & the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 18th of the 12th moth 1701.
