


Pennsylvania 55



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Richard Treviller, that we would grant him to take up one hundred acres of vacant land on Doe Run near Brandywine Creek for which he agrees to pay to ye Proprietors use twelve pounds ten shillings money of this Province in three months after the date hereof ~~the~~ and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for ever. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd forthwith to the sd Richard Treviller the sd quantity of one hundred acres of vacant land in the place aforesd according to regulation and make a return thereof into the Secretaries office, which said survey in case the sd Richard — fulfill the agreement aforesaid shall be void otherwise ~~it~~ to be void and of no other effect than as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 2^d day of ye 11th moth A. D. 171⁵/6
