

William Penn, Absolute Proprietary and Govern^t in
Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed

At the request of Peter Taylor and Joseph — son of W^m Taylor first purchasers that I would grant them a resurvey on two tracts of land in Upper Providence in the County of Chester laid out to the s^d Peter — and William — by a warr^t from T. Holme for 600 acres but returned by the Deputy for 700 — Now in the possession of Edward Pavier & W^m Beckingham, s^d Peter Taylor, Thomas Butterfield, Tho. Powel and s^d Joseph Taylor. These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurveyd the said two tracts according to their first bounds and lines of survey, and to cutt off from the one tract one hundred acres to s^d Edw^d Pavier and W^m Beckingham, and from the other 150 acres to Tho. Butterfield and 50 — to Tho. Powel; and make exact returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 6th. day of ye 1st month 170⁹
