W. 160 perch to a marked post being also a mark of Georg Meiris and from thence 5. 142 perch to a marked chesnut tree being the corner tree of Joseph Steedman and from thence <sup>150 perch</sup> S. E. B. S. along the sd Steedmans line of marked trees to the first mentioned paper.
