in ye County of Chester ~~that he want~~ for one hundred and
fifty acres of vacant land in the said township adjoyning
on his other lands there for which he is to pay to the Proprie-
tors use thirty pounds within three months from ye date here-
of at farthest. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause
to be survey'd to the said Francis Yarnal the said quantity
of one hundred and fifty acres in the place aforesaid includ-
ing that small parcel of Meadow ground of one acre or there-
abouts take up irregularly & obsumptuously by William Garreob^l
& said to be by him or his assigns inclosed within fence
which said piece of Meadow is to be joabled to ye remaind^r
of the one hundred & fifty acres in one tract ob. be laid
out altogether as regularly as the scituation of the place
& Barrens will allow and make returns thereof into the
Secretaries office, which said survey in case ye sd Francis
fulfill ye agree^{mt} obforesd shall be valid, otherwise the
same shall be void & of no effect as if it had never been
made nor this warr^t ever granted. Given under our hands
