


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Richard Murry of Philadelphia County that we would grant him to take up the quantity of five hundred acres of land the remainder of one thousand acres the original purchase made of the late Proprietor by Thomas Roberts whose brother and heir Nathanael Roberts by deeds of lease & release dated the 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> days of October anno - 1723, granted and conveyed the same unto the said Richard Murry. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed in the aforesaid right according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands and the lesser seal of the Province at Philadelphia the tenth day of December anno Domini 1726.
