At the request of Martin Urner late of Germany but now of this province that we would grant him to take up three hundred acres of land on the west side of Skoolkill — near to the land held by Henry Buckholdt for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietor's use five and forty pounds money of Pennsylvania for the whole one half thereof at the survey ~~soon~~ to be made as soon as possible and the other half in one year next after with six months interest for the same and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Martin Urner at or near the place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians & make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said Martin — fulfill the above agreement shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
