


FORM NO. 1. Pursuant to a warrant under the hand & seal of the Proprietary and Governor to me directed bearing date the 29<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1700. I do hereby certify yt I have caused to be resurvey'd unto Thomas Story, Attorney for Jos. Pike 10,000 acres of land situate in the County of Chester being part of a tract of 30,000 acres formerly laid out to Sc<sup>r</sup> Matthias Vincent & Comp<sup>y</sup> beginning at a mark'd hickory standing on the west side of Schuylkill river from thence 5° West by a line of markd trees two thousand five hundred seventy and two perches to a post set in the ground near a mark'd hickory from thence N<sup>o</sup> W<sup>1</sup> by a line of mark'd trees 870 perches to a post set in ye ground hard by a mark'd black oak, from thence N<sup>o</sup> E<sup>1</sup> by a line of marked trees 1012 perches to another post set in the ground between a black & a white oak mark'd, from thence 5° E. 435 perches to another post set in the ground, from thence N<sup>o</sup> E<sup>1</sup> by a line of mark'd trees, one thousand & nine perches to another post set in the ground standing by the sd river of Schuylkill & from thence running by the several courses of the said river (ye several distances on the said several courses amounting in all to six hundred & two perches to the first mention'd hickory tree laid out for 10,116 acres of land, the said one hundred & sixteen acres being computed to be the usual allowance for roads.

Resurvey'd (according to the time when the said work was begun) on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of ye 8<sup>th</sup> month 1700 and returned into the Proprietaries & Goverours' office Secretary's Office accord to ye above said resurvey and bounds the 3<sup>d</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1701.
