

William Penn absolute Proprietary & Govern't in
Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties
annexed.

At the request of ffrancis Worley, that I would grant him to take
up ffive hundred and fifty five acres of land in right of Thomas Bra-
sey purchaser of five thousand acres being one moiety of the remaining
part of the sd purchase untaken up and descends to ye sd ffrancis —
in right of his wife Mary the other daughter of the sd Brasey the other
moiety now granted to Caleb Pusey. These are to require thee forthwith
to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him the sd ffrancis Worley the sd
number of five hundred and fifty five acres of land in the County of Ches-
ter where it has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed
nor seated by the Indians according to the method of townships by me
appointed and make returns thereof into my Secretaries office Given
under my hand and seal at Philad'l'a the 21st day of the 12th moth 1709
