By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Daniel Worthington of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up one hundred acres of vacant land joining on the land where he is lately seated on that side next the barrens for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifteen pounds money of Pensilv<sup>a</sup> and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Daniel Worthington in the place aforesaid contiguous to his said land the said quantity of one hundred acres of vacant land and make returnis thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said Daniel —— fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the third month anno Domini 1717.
