By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Henry Worley of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up six hundred acres of land on some branch of Conestoga Creek or other Creek thereabout that is suitable for the building of a Brick Mill, for which he agrees to pay unto the Proprietors use sixty pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Henry Worley on some such creek as aforesaid and according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of six hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said Henry

fulfill the above agreement within three months after location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16th day of ye 12th month Anno Domini 1714
