These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or ~~ca~~ cause to be surveyd unto him the bank afore said and make returne thereof to ye Secretarys office dated at Philadelphia ye 2<sup>d</sup> of ye 4<sup>th</sup> mo. 1688.
