At the request of the Widow Musgrove that I would grant
her to take up five hundred acres of land in this Province in
right of Rich^d Baker first purchaser of one thousand acres.
These are to require thierforthwith to survey or cause to be sur-
vey'd to the sd Widow Musgrove the sd number of five hundred
acres of land according to the method of townships by me
appointed that has not been already survey'd nor taken up
nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make re-
turns thereof into my Secretaries office the sd Widow Mus-
grove or her assigns seating and improving the same wth in 12
months after ye date of survey. Given under my hand & seal
at Philad^{ia} ye 26th 5^{mo}. 1701.
