

Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commissioner of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 8<sup>th</sup> of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1701 granting unto Jm<sup>o</sup> Morris a survey on five hundred acres of land in part of two thousand five hundred acres by him bought of Thomas ffairman who purchased of Thomas Harley his right to five thousand acres.

There is survey'd and laid out to Jm<sup>o</sup> Morris a tract of land in the county of Philadelphia beginning at a stake in the line of Robert ffairman & at the corner of other land of the said Jm<sup>o</sup> Morris from thence ~~extending~~ extending northwest by the said Morris's land five hundred perches to another line of the said John Morris's land and by the said line south west one hundred and sixty perches to a stake from thence south east five ~~hundred~~ hundred ~~and~~ perches to a stake near a white <sup>oak</sup> at the corner of the said ffairman's land from thence by the said land north east one hundred and sixty perches to the place of the beginning containing five ~~hundred~~ hundred acres survey'd by David Powel the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the tenth month 1701.
