



Pursuivanc to a warr from Edward Pennington their Surveyor Generall bearing date ye 9th day of ye 10 mo. 1701. directed unto me I do hearby certifiey that I have surveyd ye 23^d day of the same mo. unto John Morris a certaine tract of land in the County of Philadelphia begining at a stak in the line of Jobe Bates land being a corner deviding it from other lands of ye said John Morris from thenc by a line of trees and ye same land North west 500 perches to another line belonging to another tract of ye said John Morris from thenc by a line of trees and ye same land south west 160 perches ~~to~~ to a stak sett in the ground thenc by a line of marked trees south east 500 perches to a stak neer a whit oke marked being a corner of the said Bates land from thenc by a line of marked trees and ye same land north east 160 perches to ye place of begining containing and laid out for 500 accrs of land and is according to ye bounds above described returned into the Generall Surveyors offic at Philadelphia the 22^d day of ye 7th mo. 1702.
