

By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary and Government bearing date  
 the 21<sup>st</sup> of the 8<sup>mo</sup> 1701 for laying out unto Andrew Rudman ten thousand  
 acres of land for the use of himself and several of the Swedes.  
 There was Survey'd and Laid out the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> month  
 1704 unto John Cock five hundred acres of land part of the ten  
 thousand aforesaid Situate on the East side of Schuykill in  
 the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a post by the Said Schuyll  
 Kill river At the corner of the land of Andrew Banks on then  
 the Said line North twenty degrees East one thousand one  
 hundred and sixty perches to a post then by vacant land East  
 south East sixty seven perches and a half to a post then by  
 Mounse Jones's land South twenty deg<sup>s</sup> West one thousand two  
 hundred and fifteen perches to Schuykill River Then the  
 same to the place of Beginning -- Survey'd P D. Powel
