

By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 9th of 8th 1704. There was Surveyd and laid out unto Silas Crispin Executor of the Last will and Testament of Thomas Holme five hundred acres of land ^{in Philadelphia County} Remaining un-taken up of Eleven Thousand acres Purchased by the said Thomas. Beginning at a Black oak in the Line of Limbrick township Thence northwest by the said Line one hundred sixty seven perches to a Spanish oak in the Said Line Thence South west by John Tizacks land four hundred and Eighty perches to a sapling. Then by Jacob Pollasons land southeast one hundred sixty seven perches to a post Then by ~~vacant~~ vacant Land North east four hundred and Eighty perches to the Place of the Beginning west five hundred acres.
