At the Request of Benjamin Chambers That I would grant him to take up Thirteen Acres of Liberty Land remaining due to him and Company in right ~~of~~ of a purchase of five thousand Acres by them made.

Also that I would grant ^{it} ~~the said Number of acres~~ to be taken up adjoining on the Northwest Side of his brother Jr. Chambers's Land already taken up in the Said Liberties These are to require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd

To him the Said Number of Acres in the Said Liberties of the City of

Philadelphia adjoining to his Brothers Land as aforesaid. Provided it be not already taken up and make Returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at

Philadelphia the first day of the 6th Month 1700.
