

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^t in Chief

Whereas my Comm^{r's} of Property in the year 1694 did grant unto W^m Crews to take up half a Square between the 6th & 7th Streets in the City Philadelphia at the Rent of 24 shillings p An^t, whose son John Crews convey'd all his Right in the same to Joshua Carpenter who has made Improvement to thereon. These are therefore to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be surveyed unto the sd Joshua Carpenter the sd half Square bounded by the 6th & 7th streets from the River Delaware, Chestnut Street, and the ends of the High Street Lots and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 18th of the 7th Mo 1701.
