 me I do hereby Certify into his Office that I have Surveyd and
 Laid out to James Craven the 4th of y^e 9th m^o Ensuing a
 Certaine tract of Land in a Township Called Limbrick in the
 County of philadelphia begining at a post in a street or
 Roade of Sixty foot broade Runing through the Said Town
 being a Corner post deviding it from Thomas phips Land
 from thence by the said phips Line of marked trees North
 East five hundred perches to a post Sett up in the
 ground from thence North west by a Line of marked
 trees one hundred and Sixty perches to another post
 Sett in the ground from thence South west by a Line of
 marked trees five hundred ~~two~~ perches to a post Sett in
 the ground in the Said Street or Roade from then by
 the same South East one hundred and Sixty perches
 to the place of begining Containing and Laid out for
 five hundred acres of Land
