By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of John Chandler That we would grant him to take up one hundred Acres of Land in this Province in right of his former Service to the Proprietary at and under the common rent of Servants Land: These are to require thee to Survey and lay out to the said John Chandler in the Township allotted for Servants the said quantity of one hundred Acres of Land not already taken up nor Surveyd nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary who is also to take a Duplicate of this Return into his Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 23^d of the 12th Month 1701.
