At the Request of James Clemson of the County of Chester that we would Grant him to take up five Hundred acres of Land in this Province for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifty Pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every Hundred acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto the Said James Clemson according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said Quantity of five Hundred acres of Land in the sd Province that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretaries Office which Survey in case the Said James fulfill the above agreement within three Months after Location Shall be valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made or this Warrant ever granted Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the Seventh Month Anno D'm 1714.
