Land in right of a thousand acres bought by her
late Husband Arthur Cook of Francis Burroughs
first purchase. These are to require thee forth-
with to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto her the
Said Number of acres of ^{Land} within the Liberties of
the Town of Philadelphia where it is not yet laid
out, and make Return thereof into my Secretaries
Office. Given under my Hand and Seal the 4th
day of the fifth Month 1700.
