William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern<sup>t</sup> in Chief  
of the Province of Pensilvania & Counties Annexed

At the Request of Sir Carver That I would grant him a Resurvey on his Plantation with the Lands adjoyning Situate between the Lands of Job Howel, Will<sup>m</sup> Hibbs & John Hybert and Potquessin Creek in y<sup>e</sup> County of Philadelphia reputed to be five hundred Acres formerly laid out to him by Virtue of my Warrant. These are to require three forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurveyed his Said Plantation and Tract of Land according to the old and true Lines of the former Survey ~~thereof~~ and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office, Given under my Hand & Seal at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month 1700.
