

By Vertue of a Warrant from the Proprietor and Governour bearing the 21<sup>st</sup> of October 1701 for laying out unto Andreas for the use of himself and several of the Swedes ten thousand acres of Land on the River Schuylkill,

There was Surveyd unto Jacob Culin Six hundred acres of land part of the said ten thousand acres Situate near Manatawiny on the East Side of Schuylkill in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a post by the said River at the Corner of Morton Mortons Land Thence North twenty degrees east by the said Mortons land One thousand one hundred and eighty eight perches to a post Then west north west by Vacant Land Eighty four perches to a post Then by Vacant Land south twenty degrees west one thousand one hundred and fifty perches to the River Schuylkill Then down the same on the Several Courses thereof to the place of the beginning - - J<sup>r</sup> David -
