two degrees South by the said Dickinson's Land thirty four pches to a  
small Hickery at a Corner of the said Claypoole's Land Then by  
the same North one Degree West forty three pches and three foot to  
a Corner Thence East one Degree North twenty two pches to the  
aforesaid Road Then by the same South Seventeen degrees  
West forty four pches to the place of Beginning Containing  
seven acres and one half acre
