Land from thence west by a Line of Marked trees 21 pt to another stak  
by a whit o.K marked from thence South by a Line of Marked  
trees 66 perches to another stak by a whit o.K marked from thence  
East North East 23 perches by John Marshall's Land to plac of  
begineing Containeing 8 acres of Land and is According to y<sup>e</sup>  
bounds above described Returnid into y<sup>e</sup> Generall Survey<sup>r</sup>s  
office at Philadelphia the 9<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1702
