


By Vertue of a Genl Warrant from the Commiss<sup>s</sup> of Property  
dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> mo. 1703. Resurveyd the 11<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>or</sup> 1703 unto  
Jno Marshal two hundred and fifty acres of land scituate in the town-  
ship of Darby in the County of Chester Beginning at a white oak at  
the Corner of Josiah Hibbott's land standing by the Millcreek Thence  
extending by the said Hibbott's land West one hundred and fifty  
perches to a stone Then North North west one hundred and four  
perches to a post in the line of Robert Nailers Land then by the said  
Nailers land and Samuel Seller's land North sixty six degrees east  
seventy four perches to a Gum tree then North twenty four Degrees  
west forty five perches to a Spanish oak Then North Sixty six degrees  
east seventy eight perches to a Stone Then north twenty four degrees  
west sixteen perches to a Stone Then North Seventy degrees east  
one hundred and ninety two perches to a post by the said Millcreek  
(The four last lines Runs by the land of the said Samuel Sellers.)  
Then Down the said Creek three hundred and thirty four perches to  
the beginning
