Then surveyed for Oswin Musgrave 100 acres of Land lying on the Southside of ridly Creek and beginning at a marked hickry standing by the sd creek being a corner tree of Joseph Alabone, his land and running by the sd Alabones line of marked trees S.W.b.W. 370 percht to a marked white oak and from thence N.W.b.N. 45 percht to a marked white oak from thence N.E.b.E. 330 percht to a marked red oak and from thence N.b.N. 10 percht to a block oak standing by a run and down the run on severall courses to ridly creek and down the sd ridly creek on severall courses to the first mentioned marked hickry.
