

Darby creek begining at a marked post and $\frac{1}{2}$ in
from thence running N. 308 perch to a marked
white oak being a corner tree of Bartholomew Coppock
and from thence S. W. b. W. up the sd Coppocks line of
marked trees 225 perch to a post then N. b. W. 50 perch to a marked chesnut
tree from thence N. E. b. E. 316 perch to a marked maple tree standing by Darby
creek then down the creek on several courses to a marked poste standing by
the creekside from thence S. b. W. 297 p. to a marked post standing in the line
of Georg Simcock and from thence N. W. 160 perch to the first mencheden poste.
