Whereas the former Commissioners of Property did by their Warrant in  
in ye Manor of Rockland.

ye Year 1692 Grant unto John Prew, one hundred Acres of Land adjoining  
on a Tract of the Same quantity whereon he then lived, in lieu of w<sup>ch</sup> It is

agreed that there shall be now Surveyd to ye s<sup>d</sup> John Sixty Acres joyning to his s<sup>d</sup>  
Plantation. These therefore are to authorize thee to Survey to ye s<sup>d</sup> John Prew the full  
quantity of One hundred and Sixty Acres including his whole Tract in the s<sup>d</sup>  
place  
bounding the same to ye Northeast w<sup>ch</sup> the s<sup>e</sup>sent Line of his Land extended  
towards ye Kings Road & to ye Southwest with a Division Line between him &  
ye Land now granted to Willm Cope and to the Southeast at its utmost Extent whether  
it shall contain the s<sup>d</sup> quantity or otherwise with ye s<sup>d</sup> Kings Road but in case the s<sup>d</sup> Tract be-  
tween ye s<sup>d</sup> Northeast & Southwest Bounds and his headline joyning on Jer. Cloud shall be  
found to contain above ye afores<sup>d</sup> quantity of one hundred & Sixty Acres; Thou art then to  
cutt off what Overplus there shall be found, next to ye Kings Road or where it may be for ye Prop<sup>ty</sup>  
best conveniency & make Returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philad<sup>a</sup> where this  
Warrant is to remain & a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by ye Secretary, for w<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Land the s<sup>d</sup>

J<sup>n</sup> Prew is to pay one penny Sterl. p<sup>r</sup> Acre from ye first grant thereof. Given under our hands & ye Seal  
of ye Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> of ye 11<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1702.
