


Pensilvania ss:



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Henry Pare late of Germany but now of this Province
That we would Grant him to take up among the Branches of Conestogo Creek
the quantity of Three Hundred Acres of Land for which He agrees to pay to the
use of the Propriet^{es} within three months after ye date hereof Thirty pounds Money
of Pensilvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each
Hundred acres These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be sur-
vey'd unto the said Henry Pare at the place aforesaid according to the method of
Townships the said quantity of Three Hundred acres of Land that has not been
already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns
of the same into the Secretary's Office in order for a further confirmation which
Survey in case the said Henry Pare fulfill the above agreement shall be valid
otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant
ever granted Given under our hands and y^e seal of the Province at Philad^{ia}
