the 9th month 1702 for surveying unto Joseph Pike 700 acres in ye County
of Chester.

Survey'd and laid out ye 9th of the 2^d month 1703 unto Joseph Pike seven hun-
dred acres of land in the County of Chester beginning at a white oak at the corner of
a Tract of Land laid out to the Children of Thomas Musgrave deceased thence EX-
tending by the said land north 240 perches to a chesnut tree thence East
three perches to a white oak Then North by the Proprietary's land 240 perches
to a chesnut tree Then west by Vacant land 235 perches to a Hickery tree
Then by other Land of the said Pike, south 480 perches to a corner stone
Thence by Vacant land and by the land of the said Musgraves Children east
