

This may certifie^{ye} there was Surveyd for David Powel the quantity of five hundred acres of Land on the Northern Branch of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester in Right of his ~~Patties~~ purchase of Clement Plumsted and Sarah Hall. Begining at a black oak marked at a corner of Jonathan Wynn's Land and running by the said Wynn's Line West four hundred perches, crossing the said Branch to a hickery tree at another corner of the said Wynn's land Then ~~wouth~~ by a line of mark'd trees on the same Course Eighty six perches to a Post Then by a line of mark'd trees, South one hundred Seventy five perches to a post Then East by a line of marked trees four hundred eighty six perches to a post Then North by a line of marked trees One hundred and Seventy five perches to the place of Begining containing five hundred acres with an ~~over~~ addition or of Six acres & cent. This was (more properly) surveyed to Clement Plumsted and Sarah Hall on the 4th of April, 1711; but they sold the same to the said David Powel.
