By the Commissioners of Property.

(Seal) At the Request of David Priest of Conestogo that we would Grant him a certain parcel of Land near that place, first seated by Allen Robinet without license some years ago and in the Tenure of the said David containing about one hundred and fifty acres for which he agrees to pay to the Use of the Trustees of the Province, Twenty pounds Money there-^{now is} for the whole and ye yearly quitrent of one Shilling & Sixpence Sterling for the same. These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said David Priest in the place aforesaid the said quantity of one hundred and fifty acres of Land and make exact Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said David fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this War-
rant ever granted Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 5th day of December Anno Dni 1719. Richd. Hill.
