These are to Authorize thee to Survey and lay out to the sd John Powel and Samuel Robinet in right of their said wives according to the Method of Townships appointed the said number of two hundred and sixty five Acres of Land in ye County of Chester that has not been already Survey'd nor is to taken up, nor is conceal'd nor seated by the Indians and make Returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia by a Copy hereof certified by the Secretary Given under our hands &c seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 15th day of November 1706.
