


Pensylvania:



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Anthony Preter of East Jersey that we would Grant him to take up three hundred Acres of Land near Pecquean or to the Southward of Cornestogoe Creek for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use thirty Pounds within three Months after Survey and ye yearly Quittrent of one English Shilling for each hundred for ever: These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or Cause to be survey'd to the said Anthony Preter according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of three hundred Acres of Land in ye place oforesd where not already Survey'd, appropriated nor Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the secretaries Office which Survey in case the same be made within twelve Months after the date hereof and the said Anthony duly pay the said consideration Money according to ye aforesd Agreemt shall be valid otherwise to be void & of so effect as if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever Granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad 19 the 16th day of November 1716
