

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1700:

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed and laid out unto Christopher Pennock in right of Francis and George Rogers first Purchasers of five thousand acres by them sold to George Collett the said Christopher Pennock's Father in Law, who bequeathed his whole right therein to the said Christopher and his sons a certain Tract of Land situate on the South side of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester Beginning at a post sett in the ground being a corner post of the land laid out to Thomas Mercer from thence <sup>running</sup> by his Line of marked trees south four hundred perches to another post sett in the ground from thence East two hundred perches to a Corner post of the land laid out to Thomas Story Attorney for Joseph Pikes from thence by his Line of marked trees North four hundred perches to a marked Spanish oak from thence West by a Line of marked trees two hundred perches to the first mentioned Corner post, Containing and laid out for five hundred acres of Land. Surveyed the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month, 1700, and Returned according to the above said Survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1701.
