

Pursuant to two Warrants under the hand and Seal of the Proprietary and Governor to me directed bearing date as follows viz. the first dated the 29th day of the 8th month 1700, and the other the 14th day of the 10th month 1700.

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Thomas Mercer in right of William Ashby first Purchaser of five hundred acres by him sold to the said Thomas Mercer a certain Tract of Land situate on the South side of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester beginning at a post which is also a corner post of George Pierce's Land from thence running along by his line of marked trees North four hundred perches to a marked black oak from thence West two hundred perches to a marked Spanish oak from thence South by Christopher Pennock's line of marked trees four hundred perches to a post from thence by a line of marked trees East two hundred perches to the first mentioned corner post containing and laid out for five hundred acres of Land Surveyed the 26th day of the 10th month 1700, and returned according to ye above

said survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governor's Secretary's Office the 17th day of the 2d month 1701.
