And make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in consetture to be made in pursuance hereof, in. case the said In 2 on doe afterwards fulfill the agreem t afores shall be valid but otherwise shall be void & of no other Effect than as if the same had never been made nor this Warr ever Granted.
