William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and County Annexed

At the Request of Hannah Musgrove That I would grant her to take up four hundred Acres of Land purchased by her late husband of James Read my former Gardiner or his Executors to whom I granted for his Services five hundred Acres one hundred thereof in Bucks, and the othe-400 in Chester County: These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed to the Se Hannah Musgrove these Number of four hundred Acres of Land in the Se County of Chester or else where where it has not been already surveyd nortaken up norconcealed norseated by the Indians, She or her Assign Seating and Improving yesame within twelve Months after ye date of Survey, and make returns thereof into my secretaries Office . Given under my hand and Seal at Philade the Second of y fourth
