

Pursuant to a Warr^t under the hands of the Commiss^se of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 25th day of the 1st month 170² ordering a Resurvey on the several Tracts of Land in the Townships of Chichester Bethel Concord and Bromingham

There is Resurvey'd to the heirs of Jm^e Johnson a Tract of Land in the Township of Chichester (but not within the Limits of the Town Patent) beginning at a Plum tree on the east side of Marcus Creek being a Corner tree of Philip Roman's Land from thence extending by the said Romans Land North fourty five degrees East twenty two perches North fourty four degrees east eighty pches to a post from thence North 12 degrees west thirty seven perches to a white oak from thence north eight degrees east one hundred thirty seven perches to a black oak from thence north twenty eight degrees west ninety six perches to a spanish oak from thence by Stephen Ayles Land and Henry Worleys Land North sixty six degrees east one hundred and twenty perches to a white oak by stony Run thence down the said Run on the several Courses of the same the several distances on the said Courses added together four^{hundred} thirty nine perches to a post at the Corner of Peter Bass his Marsh from thence by the said Marsh south fifty six degrees west thirty eight perches per^s to a Run Thence down the same south thirty seven degrees east twelve perches south thirteen degrees east twelve perches to the River Delaware from thence down the same on several courses Ninety perches to an Ash tree from thence north eighteen degrees west by Philip Roman's Marsh seventy five^{ds} to a sassafras tree on the side of the fast Land from thence along the side of the fast Land south forty eight degrees west fifteen perches south thirty degrees west thirty two perches south fourty four degrees west 12 perches to a post thence south south west twelve perches to a post by a Run near Marcus Creek thence up the several Courses of the said Creek Ninety perches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred & eighteen acres whereof there is five acres in a field of Philip Roman's which is Contained within the said bounds The Rest is two hundred & thirteen acres
