At the Request of Jacob Littlemore by his Attorneys Evan Lewis and Peter Dicks both of Chester County That We would grant him to take up Three Hundred Seventy five Acres of Land the purchase made of the late Proprietor of Thomas Williamson of Groton in the County of Chester in Great Britain Since Deceased by Deed dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the fifth Month Anno 1691 which said Land by Right of Inheritance is Said to be Vested in the said Jacob Littlemore These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to Survey'd (towards Sasquahannock River) in Right of the said Purchase According to the Method of Townships Appointed the said Quantity of Three Hundred Seventy five Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Decemb<sup>r</sup> Anno 1726
